Choose an issue in society that needs to be solved!

6 Steps...

Recollect: What do you already know about the issue? What would you like to find out?

Research: 3-4 articles that explore the issue

Reason: Why does the issue exist? Why does it matter?

Respond: What do others in your community think about your issue? Find at least 4 perspectives in the LWHS community. In what ways have your feelings changed after hearing other perspectives on the issue?

React: How could your issue be improved/resolved? What are the advantages/disadvantages to your action/solution?

Reflect: What did you learn about yourself through this process? What questions do you still have?

What do you want others to know about your issue? Record a 3-5 minute podcast on an issue you care about in order to educate others or spur them to action. It may take the form of a story, speech, poem or song. Be confident, concise and creative.

Podcast should be recorded.
